

In partnership with parents, caregivers, and their communities, we seek to advance equitable, inclusive, and culturally responsive prevention and early intervention policies, systems, and practices that eliminate racial inequities, promote optimal health and development, and improve the lives of children prenatal through age five and their families.

Why is Racial Equity Important to First 5?

- Children prenatal through age 5 are particularly vulnerable to bigotry, poverty, and violence
- Systemic change to address racially-based disparities cannot occur without action to address the root causes of inequity
- Anti-racism work is foundational to achieving the mission of First 5 Sacramento




The National Parent Leadership Institute (NPLI) is a parentcentered, **anti-racist** organization that partners with parents and communities to make needed change.




